From The Pastors Desk,

In the Gospel of John chapter two we read about the *wedding in Cana*. According to the scripture the wedding planners totally botched the wine list and they were embarrassed when they ran out of liquid refreshment for the guest. The mother of Jesus then pushed Him to the forefront and the miracle of plenty occurred.

The scripture records between one hundred twenty and one hundred eighty gallons of water were transformed into wine. This was not just any wine; according to the governor of the feast it was the best wine, top shelf stuff.

I have been privileged to watch this miracle over and over again since Jesus became Lord of my life. Let me explain, Jesus took what they had (6 pots of water) and met their need. If we could just remember this principle we would be the recipients of the miracle of plenty. He didn't have a fundraiser, didn't apply for a grant, and didn't have a nervous breakdown. He simply created the plenty out of what was on hand. I want to follow the direction of Jesus mother; she said, "Do whatever he tells you to do"

This kind of miracle is happening again in our church. Our youth group is stepping out in faith believing that God will use them in miraculous ways. People have committed to travel to Haiti believing God will use what they have to touch His people. Our trustees believe that it is possible to create a parking lot large enough to meet our needs. While the world is focused on the downturn and the negative we choose to "Do whatever he tells us"

All of this is a testimony to the world that we are following the Biblical pattern that yields miracle faith and miracle results. We serve the God of the supernatural, just like the Cana miracle the best is yet to come.
