a portion of their most recent email to us: "Each year in Honduras they set aside a day to celebrate the Bible. As a school we participated in the activities in Catacamas. Several of the Evangelical Churches, 2-3 thousand people, walked the mile long parade route. Some of the Churches had a speaker in the back of a truck and played Christian music. Of course we had one! This is the third time that we have had the privilege to walk in this event. The parade ends at the town square; central park, with praise and worship and preaching of God's Word."
